Approval

Pursuant to Section 4.55(2) of the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979, as amended, Modification Application MOD2022/0204 for modifications to DA2019/0439 in accordance with the conditions of consent originally imposed at Lot 8 DP 7056 and Lots 20-23 DP 17618 known as 13-21 Wyuna Street, Beverley Park, is determined by granting approval to modify the original development consent subject to the conditions recommended in the report submitted to the Local Planning Panel meeting of 1 June 2023.

The Conditions recommended in the report to the Georges River Local Planning Panel meeting of 1 June 2023, subject to the amendments as follows:

Include additional condition 133a to read as follows:

133a. The Waste Management Plan shall be amended to reflect that the owners corporation is to engage a caretaker to:

- a) Transfer waste bins from the garbage room located on each floor to the bin store rooms located in the basement ;and
- b) Transfer bins from the bin store room in the basement to the kerb for collection and return the bins to the bin store room in the basement once collected.

Amend condition 26 to read as follows:

26. Waste Storage - Residential and Mixed Use Developments - The plans shall include details of the waste storage area. The waste storage area shall not be visible from the street. The waste storage area shall be located within the lot/building in accordance with the approved plans.

The waste storage area shall be large enough to accommodate the required number of bins for the development and located in an area to suitably facilitate servicing on waste collection day.

The path to the bin room is to be at least 1.0 metres wide and kept clear and unobstructed at all times.

Residential Waste

The development will require the provision of the following waste and recycling facilities:

- Domestic Waste 12 x 660L litre mobile bins (red lid)
- Domestic Recycling 32 x 240 litre mobile bins (yellow lid)
- Green Waste 1 to 2 x 240 litre mobile bins per apartment block.

Statement of Reasons

The reasons for this determination are that:

- The proposal remains consistent with the original approval;
- The proposed modifications to the approved plans are consistent with the objectives of the Georges River Local Environmental Plan 2021 and the Georges River Development Control Plan 2021.
- The proposed modifications to the approved plans do not result in any adverse impact on the natural and built environment.
- The proposed the modifications will not materially change the external impacts and intensity of use of the site: and
- To ensure that the Waste Management condition reflects the amended proposal and that suitable arrangements are in place for the on site management of waste.
