# **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**


 This report seeks the Committee's consideration of the proposed timed 'No Parking' restriction on Beatty Street, and proposed regulatory 'No Stopping' restriction be installed on Balmoral Road. Mortdale.

#### **BACKGROUND**

- 2. Beatty Street is an unclassified local road that has a road carriageway width of 7.7m kerb to kerb, with unrestricted parking on the eastern and western side.
- Council has received multiple requests from local residents to investigate the current parking restrictions at the intersection of Beatty Street and Balmoral Road, Mortdale, to improve sight line distance and provide sufficient space for vehicles manoeuvring the intersection.
- 4. Following the on-site investigation at the beginning of April 2024, Council Officers have observed motorists are unable to safely see oncoming traffic whilst travelling north and south along Beatty Street due to the placement of vehicles parked close to the intersection.
- 5. Council Officers have also observed vehicles attempting to turn left into Balmoral Road from Beatty Street will generally manoeuvre towards the centre of the road creating a risk for a potential head-on collision, particularly during peak morning and afternoon periods.
- 6. In April 2024, Council conducted consultation to extend the existing 'No Stopping' restrictions on the western side of Beatty Street at the intersection of Balmoral Road, Mortdale. Based on the consultation responses received, Council Officers deferred the report to be raised to a future traffic committee to conduct additional investigations.
- 7. Following additional investigations, in June 2024, Council conducted further consultation with residents to implement a timed 12m "No Parking, 7am-9am and 3pm-7pm" parking restriction.
- 8. In relation to 'No Stopping' restrictions, per the NSW Road Rules vehicles are not permitted to stop at any time.

# **PROPOSAL**

- 9. That a timed 12m 'No Parking, 7am-9am and 3pm-7pm' parking restriction be installed on the western side of Beatty Street, Mortdale.
- 10. That regulatory 9m 'No Stopping' restriction signage be installed on Balmoral Road, Mortdale.



11. Within budget allocation – TfNSW Traffic Facility Grant – approximately \$500.

# **COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT**

- 12. The proposed changes will impact the existing parking restrictions along Beatty Street and Balmoral Road, Mortdale. This requires consultation letters to be distributed prior to any recommendations to Council.

# **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

 This report seeks the Committee's consideration to install regulatory 10m 'No Stopping' signage and line marking at the intersection of Rona Street, Beale Crescent and Samuel Street, Peakhurst.

# **BACKGROUND**

- 2. Rona Street, Beale Crescent and Samuel Street, Peakhurst are unclassified local roads with a road width of 7m, 7.5m and 7.4m kerb to kerb, respectively. All streets currently have unrestricted parking.
- 3. Council has received multiple requests from local residents, bus services and Council Rangers to investigate the intersection to assess the existing traffic conditions and methods to improve the safety of vehicles.
- 4. Due to the offset configuration of the intersection, Council officers observed that vehicles currently park within 10m of the intersection creating a sight line concern for vehicles attempting to manoeuvre the intersection.
- 5. As per NSW Road Rules Reg. 170, vehicles are not permitted to park within 10m of an intersection.

# **PROPOSAL**

6. It is proposed to install regulatory 10m 'No Stopping' signage and line marking at the intersection of Rona Street, Beale Crescent and Samuel Street, Peakhurst.



7. Within budget allocation – TfNSW Traffic Facility Grant – approximately \$800 for signage and approximately \$2,000 for line marking.

# **COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT**

- 8. The proposed changes will comply with NSW Road Rules Reg. 170.
- 9. Council officers distributed consultation letters to the affected residents on Rona Street, Beale Crescent and Samuel Street, Peakhurst regarding the proposal.

- 2. The builder of a Council approved development at No. 230 West Street, Blakehurst (DA2020/0279) has requested for a 'Works Zone' to be placed fronting their development.
- 3. The requested period of the Works Zone is 16 weeks commencing July 2024.
- 4. The proposed 'Works Zone' will provide an area where vehicles associated with the works can park, allowing safe and direct access to the site.
- 5. Currently there is unrestricted parking along West Street, Blakehurst.
- 6. Any proposals associated with this development to unload materials and conduct road closures will require the additional submission of a Temporary Road, Lane and Footpath Closure application form.

# **PROPOSAL**

7. It is proposed to install a 10m "Works Zone, 7am – 5pm Mon – Sat" fronting No. 230 West Street, Blakehurst.

# **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

1. This report seeks the Committee's consideration of the proposed changes to the parking restrictions, as per the recommendations, fronting No. 64 Stanley Street, Peakhurst.

# **BACKGROUND**

- 2. Stanley Street, Peakhurst is an unclassified local road with a road width of 13m, kerb to kerb, and unrestricted parking on both sides of the street.
- 3. In 2023, 41 dwellings were constructed at No. 64 Stanley Street, Peakhurst that provide retirement apartments, and a café.
- 4. Council has received requests from local residents and businesses in the precinct to investigate the parking conditions fronting No. 64 Stanley Street to improve vehicle turnover and vehicle egress.
- 5. Council officers have investigated the existing parking conditions and determined that onstreet parking in Stanley Street is in high demand throughout the day, restricting vehicle turnover in the area.
- 6. Due to vehicles being permitted to park close to the driveway of No. 64 Stanley Street, vehicle sight lines have been impeded.
- 7. It was noted St George Community Services visits the retirement apartments on a daily basis to transport residents, however due to limited on-street parking, they would generally park across the driveway to drop off and pick up residents.
- 8. The proposed 'No Parking' restrictions will assist with sightlines for vehicle egress from the driveway, while also allowing St George Community Services and other vehicles to drop off and pick up, and utilise the café.
- 9. Per the NSW Road Rules, 'No Parking' restrictions permits motorists to stop for a period of up to 2 minutes to drop off and pick up passengers while staying within 3m of their vehicle.
- 10.A "Disabled Parking" zone will assist with visitors attending the retirement apartments and can be used by any motorist with a valid mobility parking permit. These spaces are not for the exclusive use of any one user.

# **PROPOSAL**

- 11. That a 6m "P10 minutes, 6:00am 4:00pm, Monday to Sunday" parking restriction be installed fronting No. 64 Stanley Street, Peakhurst
- 12. That a 6.5m 'Disabled Parking' zone be installed fronting No. 64 Stanley Street, Peakhurst.
- 13. That a 6.5m 'No Parking, St George Community Services Vehicles Excepted' be installed fronting No. 64 Stanley Street, Peakhurst.



- 2. Mountview Avenue and Edgbaston Road, Beverly Hills are unclassified local roads with unrestricted parking on both streets.
- 3. Council has received multiple requests from local residents to investigate the intersection to assess the existing traffic conditions and safety of vehicles manoeuvring the intersection.
- 4. Council officers have observed that vehicles currently park within 10m of the intersection that create safety concern as it affects sight lines and vehicles' ability to manoeuvre the intersection.
- 5. Currently, there is no signage at the intersection of Mountview Avenue and Edgbaston Road to advise motorists where to park.
- 6. As per NSW Road Rules Reg. 170, vehicles are not permitted to park within 10m of an intersection.

# **PROPOSAL**

7. It is proposed to install regulatory 'No Stopping' signage at the intersection of Mountview Avenue and Edgbaston Road, Beverly Hills.



8. Within budget allocation – TfNSW Traffic Facility Grant – approximately \$400.


1. This report seeks the Committee's consideration to reconstruct the existing raised threshold fronting No. 60 Waitara Parade, Hurstville Grove.

# **BACKGROUND**

- 2. Council has received a request from the developer at No. 60 Waitara Parade, Hurstville Grove to relocate the existing raised threshold to assist with the construction of two driveways for the proposed development.
- 3. Following an investigation, Council officers have determined that the threshold can be relocated to remain between the proposed two driveways.
- 4. A survey was undertaken and designed per the relevant Australian Standards by Council officers. Full reconstruction of the raised threshold and relocation of the centre dividing line marking is required to be undertaken as per the design.
- 5. The existing speed hump warning sign will remain in its existing location.

# **PROPOSAL**

6. It is proposed to reconstruct the raised threshold (speed hump) fronting 60 Waitara Parade, Hurstville Grove.

# **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

1. This report seeks the Committee's consideration of the proposed changes to the parking restrictions, as per the recommendations, on Durham Street, Hurstville.

#### BACKGROUND

- 2. In 2017, Council conducted an extensive traffic study of the Hurstville Education Precinct with an aim to review the pedestrian safety, traffic congestion and parking arrangement.
- 3. One of the key outcomes outlined the inadequate pedestrian crossing infrastructure at the intersection of Forest Road, Durham Street and Wright Street, Hurstville with recommendations to construct a signalised intersection, which was completed in October 2023.
- 4. As a result of the intersection upgrade, the installation of "No Stopping" signage was implemented on the northern and southern side of Durham Street, along with further modification to the pavement line marking to improve traffic flow in vicinity.
- 5. Since the implementation of these changes, a number of local businesses have raised concerns around the lack of on-street parking in the area.
- 6. To ensure the businesses continue to have sufficient on-street parking in the vicinity to facilitate vehicle turnover throughout the day, Council officers undertaken an investigation to review the existing traffic movements and parking conditions, to determine the potential to reinstate parking for businesses, customers and residents.

- 7. The reinstatement of on-street parking and introduction of a Left in/Left out movement for all driveways on the northern and southern side of Durham Street will have no significant adverse impact on the current road network and traffic flow operations.
- 8. The development also has an alternate access and egress point through Jack Brabham Drive that will be utilised following completion of the adjacent development.

- 9. That "1P, 9.30am to 3.30pm, Monday to Friday" parking restrictions be installed on the northern side of Durham Street, Hurstville.

- 12. That "Loading Zone 7am to 5pm, Monday to Friday, 30-minute limit" parking restrictions be installed fronting No. 112 Durham Street, Hurstville.
- 13. That "No Stopping 6am to 7pm" parking restrictions are installed on the southern side of Durham Street, Hurstville.



- 4. Beverley Park Golf Club staff vehicles are required to display a permit with the company logo on their vehicle's dashboard while parked within the designated location.
- 5. The proposed parking restriction will also assist with golf club patrons to drop off and pick up.
- 6. As per the NSW Road Rules, "No Parking" restrictions permit motorists to stop for a period of up to 2 minutes to drop off and pick up passengers while staying within 3m of their vehicle.

# **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

1. This report seeks the Committee's consideration to extend the existing "P5, 8am-9:30pm and 2:30pm-4pm School Days" parking restriction fronting 4 The Mall, South Hurstville.

# **BACKGROUND**

- 2. Council has received a request from South Hurstville Kindergarten located at 4 The Mall, South Hurstville to extend the existing timed parking fronting the school to improve pick-up and drop-off parking accessibility for parents, and safety of children.
- 3. Council officers have undertaken on-site investigations and have observed that a high number of parents utilise the existing timed parking zone as a drop off and pick up zone through peak morning and afternoon periods.
- 4. The existing five (5) minute parking restriction accommodates a maximum of two (2) standard-sized passenger vehicles, and due to high vehicle occupancy throughout the entire street, there is insufficient space for other parents to safely drop off and pick up their children.
- 5. Council officers also noted that motorists were often observed to be blocking neighbouring driveways while dropping off and picking up their children.
- 6. The proposed extension of the existing parking restrictions will accommodate up to three (3) standard-sized passenger vehicles.
