

Item: TAC032-25 Edward Street, Carlton - Proposed 'Parking Restriction'

RECOMMENDATION

a) That a 26m 'No Parking' restriction be installed on the northern side of Edward Street, Carlton, as per the plan in the report.

- b) That a 10m 'No Stopping' restriction be installed on the southern side of Edward Street, Carlton, as per the plan in the report.
- c) Council note that based on current data there is no evidence to support traffic calming devices at this location.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1. This report seeks the Committee's consideration of the installation of 'No Parking and No Stopping' restrictions signage at Edward Street, Carlton.

BACKGROUND

- 2. Council has received multiple requests from residents and Councillors regarding traffic conditions and safety along Edward Street, Carlton.
- 3. Edward Street is a two-way local road running in a north-south direction, connecting Tanner Avenue, Colvin Avenue and Princes Highway. On-street parking is generally permitted on both sides of this road.
- 4. There has been significant development at the corner of Edward Street and Princes Highway including the development of an Aldi supermarket and high density residential developments.
- 5. Council Officers reviewed the most recent five years of crash data, spanning from 2018 to 2023, and found no recorded crashes on Edward Street between Tanner Avenue and Princes Highway.
- 6. To understand the impact of the development and respond to community requests, in April 2025, Council conducted traffic counts at four locations along Edward Street and Colvin Avenue. Key results of the traffic count are detailed in the following table:

- 7. This data shows speed along Edward Street and Colvin Avenue within the default speed limit of 50k/h which is normal compared to other local areas. Survey data also indicates there has been an increase in average daily traffic (AADT) along these streets due to the Aldi supermarket and high-density residential development corner of Edward Street and Princes Highway.
- 8. Morning and afternoon peak hour traffic volume along Edward Street and Colvin Avenue are well below the environmental capacity of 300 vehicles per hour, which does not necessitate any treatment along these streets.
- 9. Based on the latest speed data, speed calming devices are not warranted along Edward Street at this stage. However, Council will continue monitor this road to determine if any speed calming devices are warranted in the future.



10. Following table outlines 2018 and 2020 traffic survey data at site 1 and site 2. 2018 & 2020 Traffic Survey Data (No data available for Site 3 and 4)



- 11. Council officers conducted on-site inspections in Edward Street, Carlton in April 2025. Following site observations, it was observed that vehicles are currently parking too close to Aldi driveway and close to Princes Highway intersection that reduce sight lines for vehicle leaving Aldi Supermarket.
- 12. The proposed 'No Parking' restrictions adjacent to Aldi driveway will prevent vehicle park too close to driveway and blocking sight line for vehicle exiting Aldi supermarket.
- 13. As per the Australian Road Rules, motorists are not permitted to stop within 10m of an intersection. To assist with safe vehicle thoroughfare, Council will be implementing regulatory 'No Stopping' restrictions at the intersection of Princes Highway and Edward Street. This will ensure that there is sufficient space and sight lines for motorists travelling through the intersection safely.
- 14. The proposed 'No Parking and No Stopping' restrictions will improve traffic flow and safety along Edward Street, Carlton.

PROPOSAL

- 15. That a 26m 'No Parking' restriction be installed on the northern side of Edward Street, Carlton, as per the plan in the report.
- 16. That a 10m 'No Stopping' restriction be installed on the southern side of Edward Street, Carlton, as per the plan in the report.

17. Within budget allocation – TfNSW Traffic Facility Grant – approximately \$400 for signage.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

- Council officers have undertaken community consultation of the proposed no parking and no stopping restrictions on Edward Street, Carlton.
- 19. Council has received five responses from the residents, three strongly in favour, one neutral and one strongly against the proposal.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1. This report seeks the Committee's consideration of the installation of double dividing line marking and 'No U Turn (R2-5n)' signage on West Street, Carlton.

BACKGROUND

- 2. Council has received multiple requests from resident to install No U Turn signage to address unsafe traffic conditions due to motorists making illegal U Turn at 453 Princes Highway driveway at West Street adjacent to Princes Highway intersection, Carlton.
- 3. Following an investigation by Council officers, it was observed that currently there is a 20m double dividing line marking along West Street frontage to 453 Princes Highway indicate that U Turn is not permitted at this location.
- 4. It is also observed that there is no provision of right turn facilities within 1km north of West Street for southbound vehicle along Princes Highway including Princes Highway and Park Road intersection.
- 5. Due to lack of right turn facilities on Princes Highway, some motorists use first available right turn at the West Street intersection with Princes Highway then immediately make an illegal U Turn at 453 Princes Highway driveway to reach their destination on the northern side of Princes Highway residential and commercial catchment.
- 6. Council has raised the illegal U Turn issue with St George Police on several occasions. However, this issue has not been completely resolved.
- 7. The proposal will reinforce No U Turn restriction adjacent to Princes Highway and improve safety.

PROPOSAL

- 8. That existing double dividing line marking be extended by 10m north of 453 Princes Highway driveway along West Street, Carlton as per the Plan in the report.
- 9. That 'No U Turn (R2-5n)' sign be installed on the existing pedestrian refuge island in West Street, Carlton as per the Plan in the report.



10. Within budget allocation – TfNSW Traffic Facility Grant – approximately \$800 for signage and line marking.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

- 11. Council Officers have undertaken community consultation of the proposed changes in signage and line markings on West Street, Carlton.
- 12. Council has received no responses from the residents.

1. This report seeks the Committee's consideration of the proposed 'Works Zone' fronting No. 13 Kingsway, Kingsgrove.

BACKGROUND

- 2. The builder of a Council approved development at No. 13 Kingsway, Kingsgrove has lodged a request for a 'Works Zone' to be placed fronting their development.
- 3. The requested period of the proposed 'Works Zone' is 12 weeks commencing Mid-April 2025.
- 4. The proposed 'Works Zone' will provide an area where vehicles associated with the development can park, allowing safe and direct access to the site.
- 5. Any proposals associated with this development to unload materials and conduct road closures will require the additional submission of a Temporary Road, Lane and Footpath Closure application form.

PROPOSAL

6. It is proposed to install a 13m 'Works Zone, 7am – 5pm, Monday – Saturday' fronting No. 13 Kingsway, Kingsgrove

1. This report seeks the committee's consideration to remove the mobility parking space fronting No 75 Bristol Road, Hurstville.

BACKGROUND

- 2. Council has received a request from the current tenant and rangers, to remove the mobility parking signs, fronting No. 75 Bristol Road, Hurstville.
- 3. Council grants mobility parking spaces when the following is demonstrated:
 - a. The applicant is a resident living at the address.
 - b. The applicant has an approved TfNSW mobility parking scheme (MPS) permit.
 - c. The property does not have accessible off-street parking.
- 4. Dedicated mobility parking spaces are available to all persons who hold a valid MPS permit.
- 5. Council officers aim to complete the review of the dedicated mobility parking spaces over the next 12 months.
- 6. It has been brought to Council's attention that the resident that required a "Mobility Parking" space has deceased and the mobility parking space is no longer required.

PROPOSAL

7. Upon investigation of this request, it is proposed to remove the "Mobility Parking" space fronting No 75 Bristol Road, Hurstville.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1. This report seeks the Committee's consideration of the proposed changes to the parking restrictions in Anderson Road, Mortdale.

BACKGROUND

- 2. Anderson Road is an unclassified local road that has a split carriageway width of 3.9m and 7.7m kerb to kerb.
- 3. The location is an industrial area with heavy vehicle traffic.
- 4. Council has received multiple requests from residents and businesses to investigate the current parking conditions at the split road location of Anderson Road, Mortdale.
- 5. Following investigations by Council Officers, motorists are unable to safely manoeuvre along Anderson Road at the split road location. Council Officers have also observed vehicles parked illegally, resulting in a potential collision due to vehicles obstructing the road and sight line of motorist.
- 6. Council officers have observed motorists are unable to safely see oncoming traffic whilst travelling along the road lane due to the placement of vehicles parked close to the split road location. This has created an unsafe traffic flow especially for waste management trucks and emergency vehicles.
- 7. Council's proposed 'No Stopping' restriction will improve vehicle thoroughfare and safety for all motorists, businesses, and residents.
- 8. As per NSW Road Rules Reg. 170, regulatory 'No Stopping' restrictions will be installed 10m & 18m at the split road location of Anderson Road, Mortdale. It will assist large vehicles manoeuvring through the split road location.

PROPOSAL

- 9. That 'No Stopping' restrictions be installed on the split road location of Anderson Road, Mortdale.
- 10. That 10m & 18m 'No Stopping' restrictions be installed on Anderson Road, Mortdale.



11. Within budget allocation – TfNSW Traffic Facility Grant – approximately \$500.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

- 12. Businesses and residents have been notified by letter of the proposed parking changes. The closing date for submissions was Thursday 1 May 2025.
- 13. Council has received 1 response "Strongly Against" the proposal.

- 2. Council's waste collection services have requested to modify the existing parking restrictions on Targo Road, Beverley Park on waste collection days to align the new waste collection contract during 2024/2025 financial year.
- 3. The new waste collection contract resulted in a change of bin collection day for the multiunit dwelling 1A Targo Road, Beverley Park.
- 4. The justification for maintaining 'No Parking' restrictions in your street includes, but is not limited to:
 - a. Improving sight line distance for motorists and waste collection contractors undertaking waste collection services
 - b. Providing sufficient space for waste collection vehicles manoeuvring the street, and undertaking essential waste collection services
 - c. Enhancing pedestrian, waste collection contractor staff and community safety
 - d. Ensuring essential waste collection services can continue to be provided by the Council's contracted waste collection vehicle fleet.
- 5. This assists eligible multi-unit developments to present their bins for collection and reduces the duration bins are left on public land.

PROPOSAL

6. It is proposed to install 'No Parking, 6am – 6pm Monday and Friday' restrictions on the northern side of Targo Road, Beverley Park to provide safe and sufficient space for waste collection vehicles to manoeuvre through the street.



7. Within budget allocation – TfNSW Traffic Facility Grant – approximately \$200.

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

8. Waste collection services have notified the affected multi-unit dwelling, Tuesday 25th March 2025.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1. This report seeks the Committee's consideration of the proposed 'Works Zone' fronting No. 13A Montgomery Street, Kogarah.

BACKGROUND

- 2. A building contractor assigned to repair an existing building facade at No. 13 Montgomery Street, Kogarah has lodged a request for a 'Works Zone' to be placed fronting the building's non-complaint facade.
- 3. The requested period of the proposed 'Works Zone' is 8 weeks commencing Mid-May 2025.
- 4. The proposed 'Works Zone' will provide an area where vehicles associated with the development can park, allowing safe and direct access to the site.
- 5. Any proposals associated with the repairs to the building facade to unload materials and conduct road closures will require the additional submission of a Temporary Road, Lane and Footpath Closure application form.
